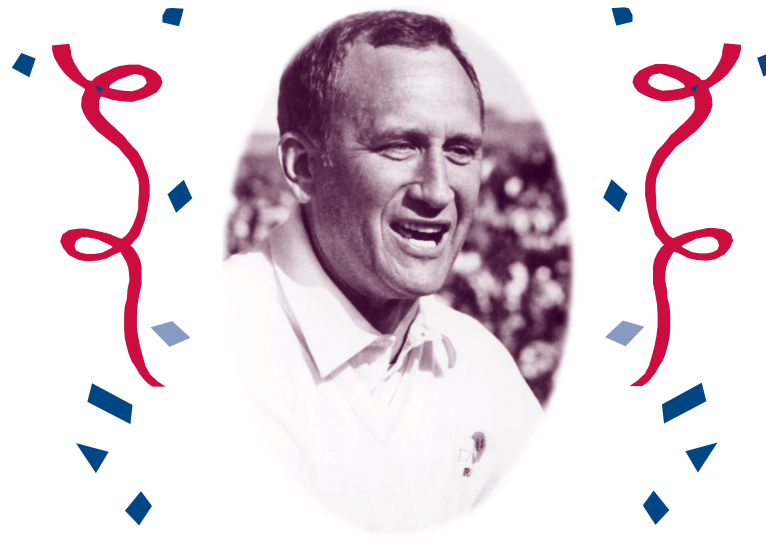

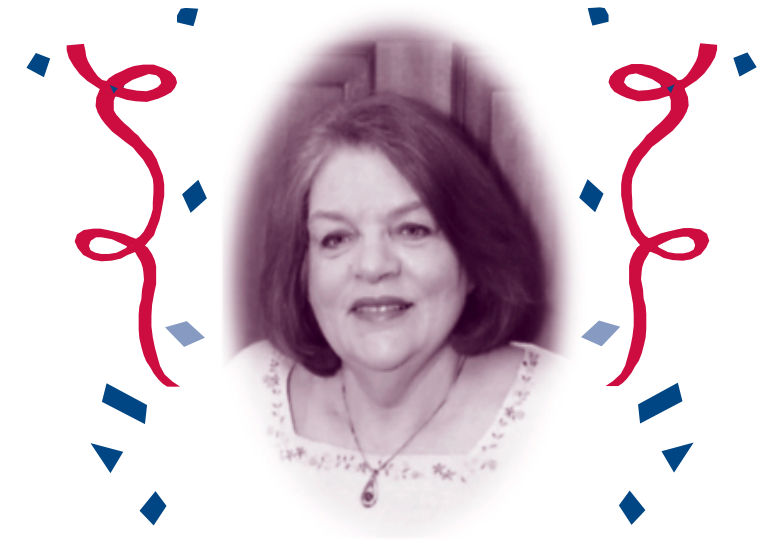

Gerry attended the University of Dayton where he earned three letters in football as a quarterback. Gerry became the 24th head coach of Notre Dame University in 1980. In 1985 Gerry became head coach at the University of Akron. He is now retired from coaching, and resides in Akron, OH.

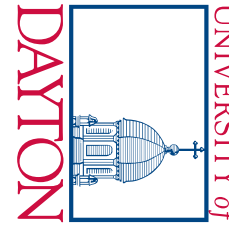
