

September 13, Hannaford Hall **Election Update**

Presenter: Bill Nemitz, columnist, Portland Press Herald

Bill will discuss the presidential race as well as its implications for "down-ballot" races on the Maine ballot. Will Hillary Clinton be the nation's first female president? Could Donald Trump actually win this thing? A look back, and ahead, at an election season for the ages.

Sept. 20, Hannaford Hall Jobs for Maine: National and International Competitiveness

Presenter: Mike Dubyak, chairman, WEX Inc.; co-chair, FocusMaine

When Mike joined WEX over 30 years ago, the new Maine company had about 20 staff members. Today, WEX has 2,000 associates in 10 countries, including 600 in its South Portland headquarters. Mike will share how this success story evolved and how it now guides his leadership of FocusMaine, a collaboration of business leaders working to energize Maine's economy.

September 27, Room 102 Wishcamper Acadia National Park: The Geography of Philanthropy

Presenter: Ken Olson, president & CEO, Friends of Acadia, 1995–2006; co-author, Acadia National Park: A Centennial Celebration

Acadia National Park — owned by all of us, created by other-than-us — is Maine's most visited natural destination. It is the first national park sprung full-blown from private philanthropy. Learn about its generous founders, the role of nonprofits in park protection, and issues facing Acadia's managers at the park's one-century mark.

October 4, Hannaford Hall Revealing and Healing Maine — Wabanaki Relations: Past and Present

Presenters: Carol Wishcamper, former commissioner and co-chair, Maine Wabanaki State Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission; Penthea Burns, co-director, Maine-Wabanaki REACH

Hear Carol and Penthea describe the work of the Maine State Wabanaki Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission as it explored the disproportionate removal of native children from their families and communities. Hear the words of the people who courageously shared their personal experiences, and learn more about Maine-Wabanaki REACH's ongoing efforts to promote healing and change.

October 11, Hannaford Hall From Cole to Contemporary — Maine's Exceptional Legacy in American Art

Presenter: Suzette McAvoy, executive director and chief curator, Center for Maine Contemporary Art


