Lectures will be held on the Portland campus of the University of Southern Maine in Room 102 of the Wishcamper Center or in Hannaford Hall at the Abromson Center. Locations are noted for each lecture.

## September 12, Hannaford Hall American Character: Understanding and Overcoming America's Political Polarization

Presenter: Colin Woodard, Author, Historian, and Journalist

We've never been one America but several Americas, and these Americas have never seen eye to eye on the important issues in our political conversation. Colin will explore the staggering 400-year backstory that helps explain today's political and cultural polarization and discuss how one could build a super-majority consensus that would allow the country's shared institutions to function again.

## September 19, Wishcamper Room 102 Mother Earth Has a Fever: What's New on the Climate Watch?

Presenter: Dr. Paul Mayewski, Director/Professor, University of Maine Climate Change Institute

Paul has led more than 55 expeditions into the remotest reaches of the planet to research how the climate system operates and how humans have been involved. He and his colleagues are applying their scientific findings and newly developed software tools to allow transparent public access to climate data, resulting in a new framework for climate prediction, the latest innovation in a series of approaches to climate change.

## September 26, Wishcamper Room 102 Strengthen Voices in the Land of Crazy Horse

Presenter: Kevin Hancock, President, Hancock Lumber Company

Discover how Kevin's rare voice disorder led him to a remote Lakota Sioux reservation in the Northern Plains. Learn how the profound effect of encountering a community that felt it too had no voice helped Kevin create a fresh vision for leadership in the modern age.

### October 3, Wishcamper Room 102 Legal Challenges to the State of Maine

Presenter: Janet T. Mills, Maine Attorney General

Janet Mills is Maine's chief law enforcement officer. In 1980 she was elected District Attorney for Androscoggin, Franklin, and Oxford Counties, the first woman serving in that capacity in New England. She has been elected to four terms as Attorney General and will speak about Maine's current legal challenges.

## October 10, Wishcamper Room 102 The Rise and Fall of Jefferson's Empire

Presenter: Peter S. Onuf, Thomas Jefferson Foundation Professor of History, Emeritus, University of Virginia

Professor Onuf is a leading historian, author, and editor. He is the Mellon Distinguished Scholar in Research of the American Antiquarian Society and is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Presenter: Kara Wooldrik, Executive Director, Portland Trails


