March 17 Working with Wardens in the Woods: Finding Hope and Healing

April 7 Letters from the Field: A Midwife's Experience with Women and War

She will describe the day-to-day realities of caring for women and their families in the African bush and share her personal insights into the challenges of culture and politics.

April 14 The City Reborn: Victorian Portland through the Lens of Marquis F. King
