

May 7, Room 102 Wishcamper Threats in the Backyard: On the Trail of Emerging Tick-Borne Diseases

Robert P. Smith MD, MPH; Director, Vector-borne Disease Laboratory, Maine Medical Center Research Institute; Professor of Medicine, Tufts University School of Medicine; Director, Division of Infectious Disease, Maine Medical Center

In just 30 years, five new infectious diseases have appeared in Maine, all transmitted by the invasive deer tick (blacklegged tick). The diseases it carries are on the rise throughout Maine, including ones particularly impacting seniors. Dr. Robert Smith examines how ecologic change leads to new disease threats and explains what we can do to respond.
