1. Course Information

1A. Course Description

In this course, students will learn and apply the principles of organizational behavior (OB). We will examine a number of OB theories and concepts, and explore how they relate to employees' work attitudes and performance. This course is structured to reflect the three interwoven levels of management: an individuals, a group, and the organization as a whole. At the individual person level, an employee's personality, ability, and values may affect their work outcomes. At the group level, group members' roles, goals, work processes, and interpersonal relationships influence members' and the group's work outcomes. At the organizational level, the organization's structure and culture affect all members' and the organization's performance. This course is delivered in the online asynchronous format.

2C. Assessment Descriptions & Requirements

1. Chapter Quizzes (11 @ 20 points each)

There is a quiz for each week's assigned chapter readings. Each quiz includes multiple choice questions randomly drawn from a large question pool. Each quiz is worth 20 points. You can take each quiz twice (on Brightspace) and the higher score will be your final grade for the quiz. Each time when you take the quiz, you must finish it in 60 minutes. The lowest quiz grade will not count toward your final grade. Quiz Z is required and it tests a student's understanding of the Syllabus and policies associated with the Group Project. No grades of any other work will be counted until a student gets 100% on Quiz Z, which can be taken unlimited times. The grade of Quiz Z will not count toward the final grade.

2. Weekly Written Assignments (9 @ 20 points each)

There is a written assignment that you need to complete each week. Specific instructions are provided for each of these assignments on Brightspace. There is a rubric applicable for all written assignments. Read the rubric carefully before you work on an assignment. You must use the assignment instruction file to complete each weekly assignment. DO NOT use a separate new file for any of these weekly assignments. Also, you must follow point "2D. Writing Style & Formatting" below for all written work. The lowest assignment grade will be dropped from your final grade calculation.

3. Midterm (80 points) & Final Exam (100 points)

There are two exams, a Midterm Exam and a Final Exam. Each exam has a 2-hour time limit and can be taken only once. Each exam has at least a 48-hour time window (see the course schedule), during which students must complete the exam. Missing the exam will result in a grade of zero. Each exam can be accessed only one time. Once a student starts an exam, he/she must finish all questions within the time limit.

4. Step 1-2 of Group Project (40 points)

Each student must complete the first two steps of the Group Project. Next, each group pools data from each member to put into the Table in the file of "Group Project Instructions". Then, the group submits the partially finished Table in a Word (.docx) file to Brightspace. Only one submission from each group is sufficient.

5. Step 3 of Group Project (40 points)

Each group must complete the partially finished Table above and submit it in a Word (.docx) file to Brightspace. Only one submission from each group is sufficient.

6. Group Project Paper (70 points) & Group Project Presentation (70 points)

Each group will complete a Group Project Paper and present their project at the end of the semester. Detailed instructions for the project paper and the project presentation are provided on Brightspace.



7. Peer & Self Evaluation (2 @ 20 points each)

The Self & Peer Evaluation-1 is due before Step 3 of the Group Project is completed. Self & Peer Evaluation-2 is due at the end of the semester. The aggregated results of both Self & Peer Evaluation from all members in a group will be considered together to provide the basis for grade adjustments for individual members. Usually, when every member receives the same grade but the Self & Peer Evaluation results suggest an uneven grade allocation is fairer, then grade adjustments will take place based on the aggregated Self & Peer Evaluation results.

If a member fails to submit the Self & Peer Evaluation-1, then this member's grades for Step 1-3 of the Group Project (80 points max) will be reduced by 50%. If a student fails to submit the Self & Peer Evaluation-2, his/her group project grades (paper & presentation, 140 points max) will be reduced by 50%. The Self & Peer Evaluation forms are posted on Brightspace in the week/module when they are due.

2D. Writing Style & Formatting

- 1. All written work (assignments, paper, presentation slides, etc.) should follow the guideline of APA 7 to properly credit any external sources of information used in the work. Failing to do so is considered plagiarism and violation of academic integrity.
- **2.** Text should always use double-spacing, Times New Roman, 12 point font, and 1 inch margin on all sides.
- **3.** All written work must be submitted in either Word (.docx) or PDF format. Mac documents (e.g., .page) and documents in any other formats cannot be opened by Brightspace and the professor's computer, therefore, they will not be graded and receive a zero. Students can freely download Office 365 (Word, PPT, etc.) from USM IT Service website.

2E. Final Examination/Final Project

The final exam will be online and administered during the final exam week. The group project paper is due at the end of the semester before the final exam week starts. The group project presentations will be conducted in the last week before the final exam week. Specific information about these items can be found on Brightspace.

4. Course-Specific Policies

4A. Attendance

There is no attendance policy due to the online asynchronous mode. Any missed work including exams will result in a grade of zero.

4B. Late Work

- The first time a student submits a late work, he/she gets the benefit of the doubt and there is no penalty.
- The second time, the late work loses 20% of points per day late. For example, a work is 2 days (i.e., more than 24 hours and less than 48 hours) late and its quality earns a grade of 18/20. However, because it is 2 days late, it will lose 20% × 2 = 40% of 18/20. The final grade will be $18/20 \times (100\% 40\%) = 11/20$. This also indicates that if a work is late for 5 or more days (i.e., more than 96 hours), its grade will be zero.
- After the second late work, any additional late work from the student will not be graded and will receive a zero.
