**DOROTHY B. PADULA MEMORIAL FUND
FOR STUDENT TRAVEL TO LATIN AMERICA**

The Dorothy B. Padula Memorial Fund is to support student travel to Latin America. Awards range from \$300-\$1500. To be eligible for this scholarship, you must:

- Be currently enrolled as a graduate or undergraduate degree candidate at USM
- Have a 2.5 GPA or higher.
- Have submitted a study away application with the Office of International Programs (if you are planning to earn credit overseas).

Award recipients are expected to provide a report on their experiences abroad within 30 days of their return. Please note that students will not normally be funded for the same experience, course or program for a second time.

The following items are required in addition to the application form:

- Official Copy of your transcript (unless already submitted to the Office of International Programs).
- Short 1,000 word personal statement describing your proposed activity and how it will enrich your academic life at USM.
- Recommendation from a faculty member who has taught you (unless already submitted to the Office of International Programs)

You may apply for this scholarship prior to travel, applications due:

- October 4, 2019: For Spring 2020 and January term
- March 13, 2020: For Summer and Fall 2020, AY 2020/2021
