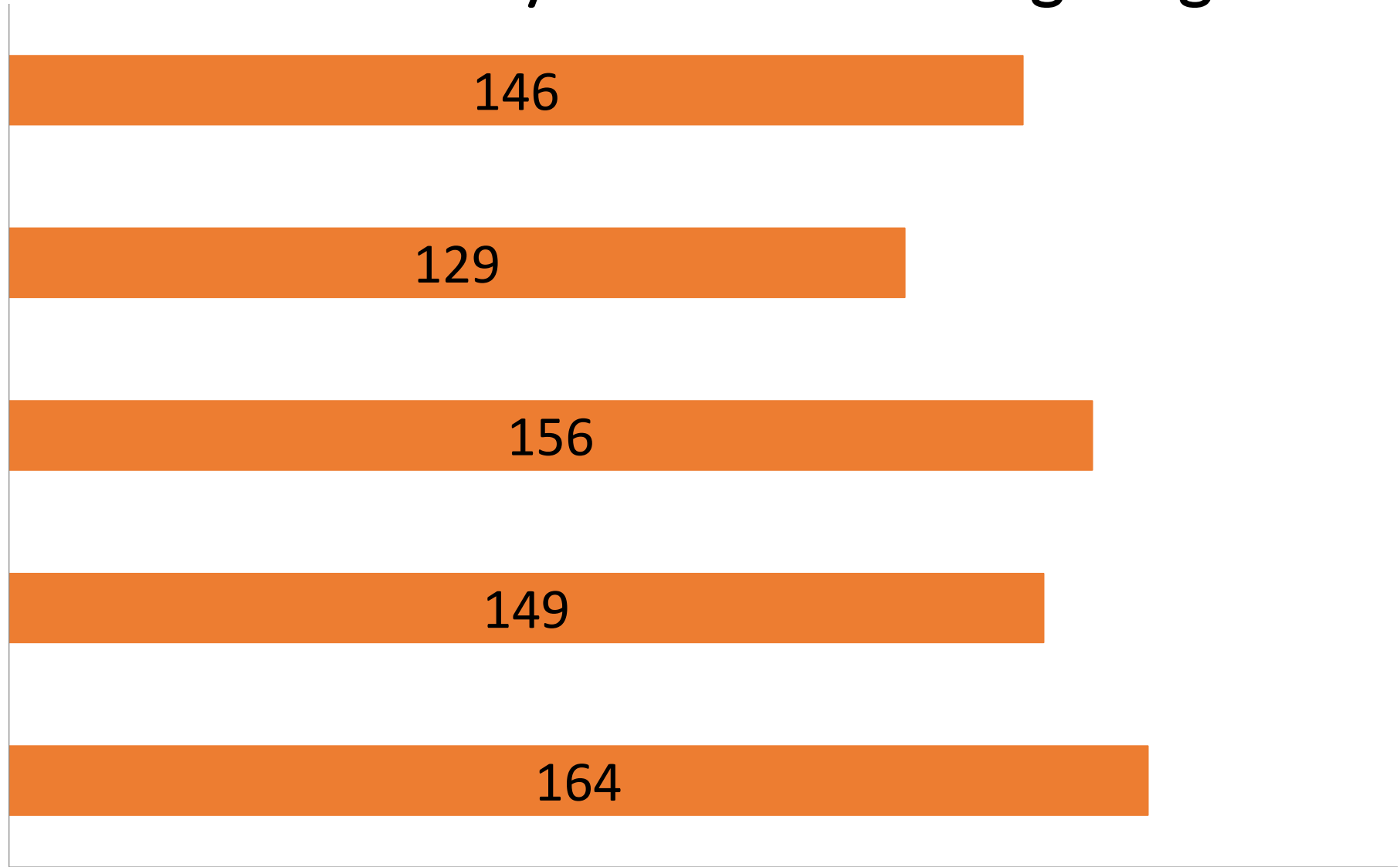

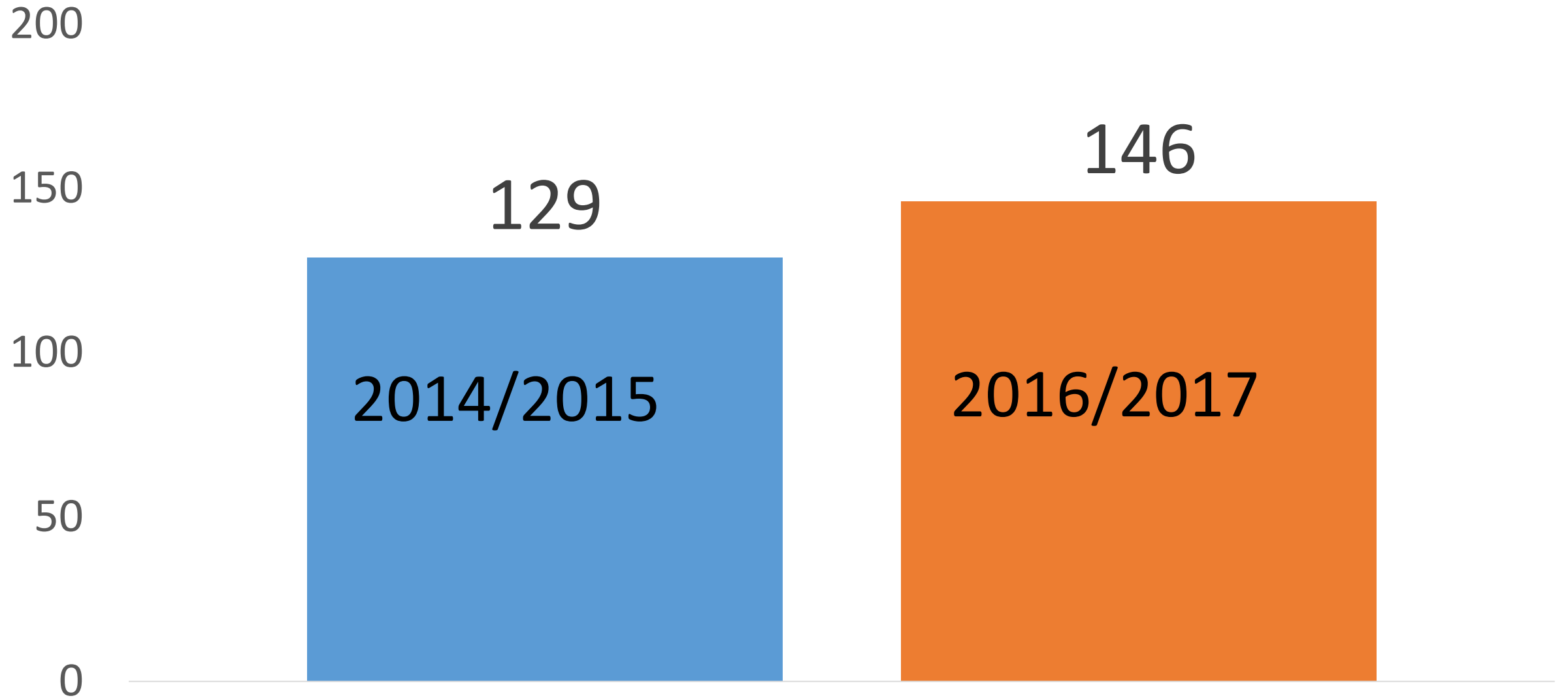

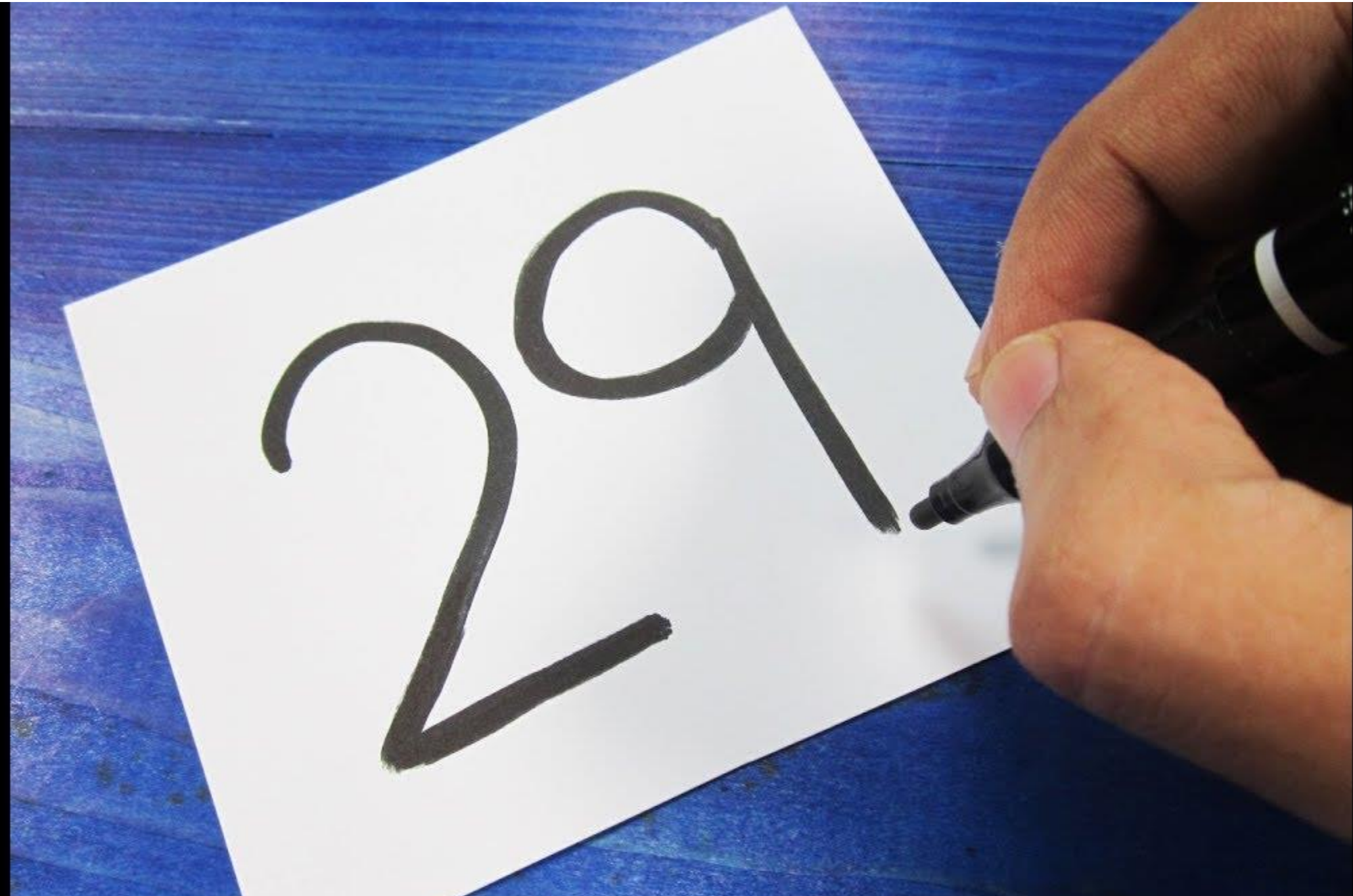

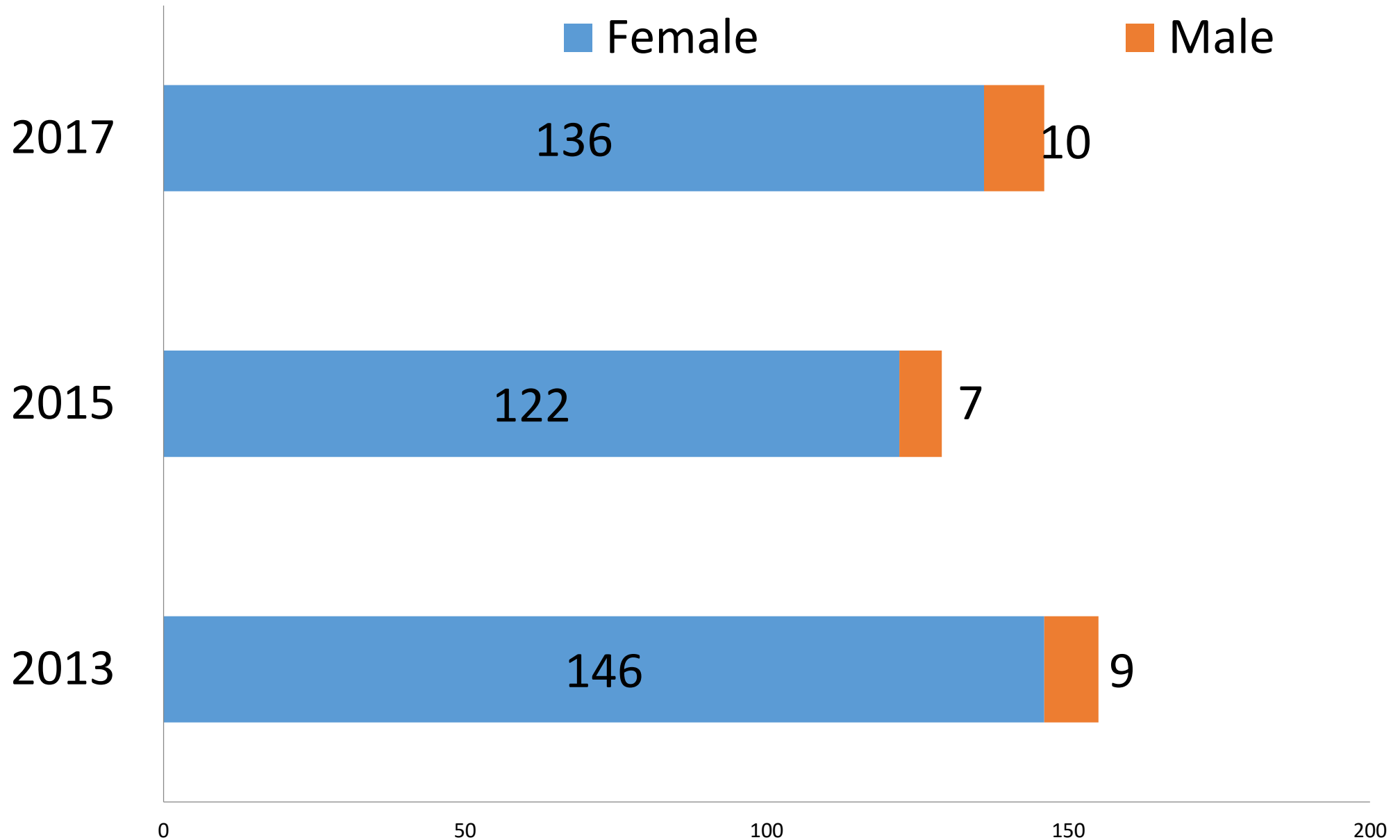
Number of Full Time Faculty in Maine Nursing Programs



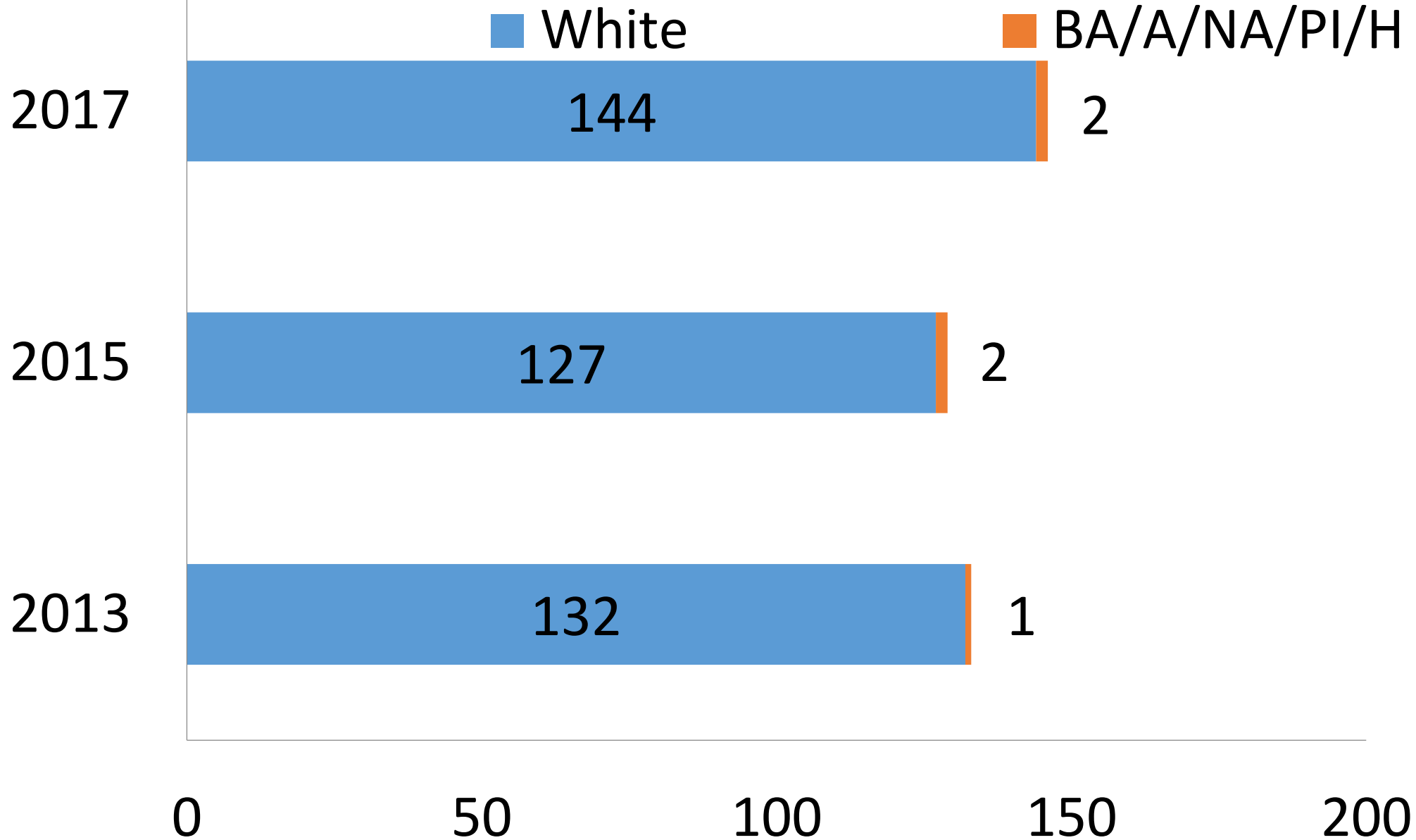
PROJECTED Vacant Full Time Positions in 2018

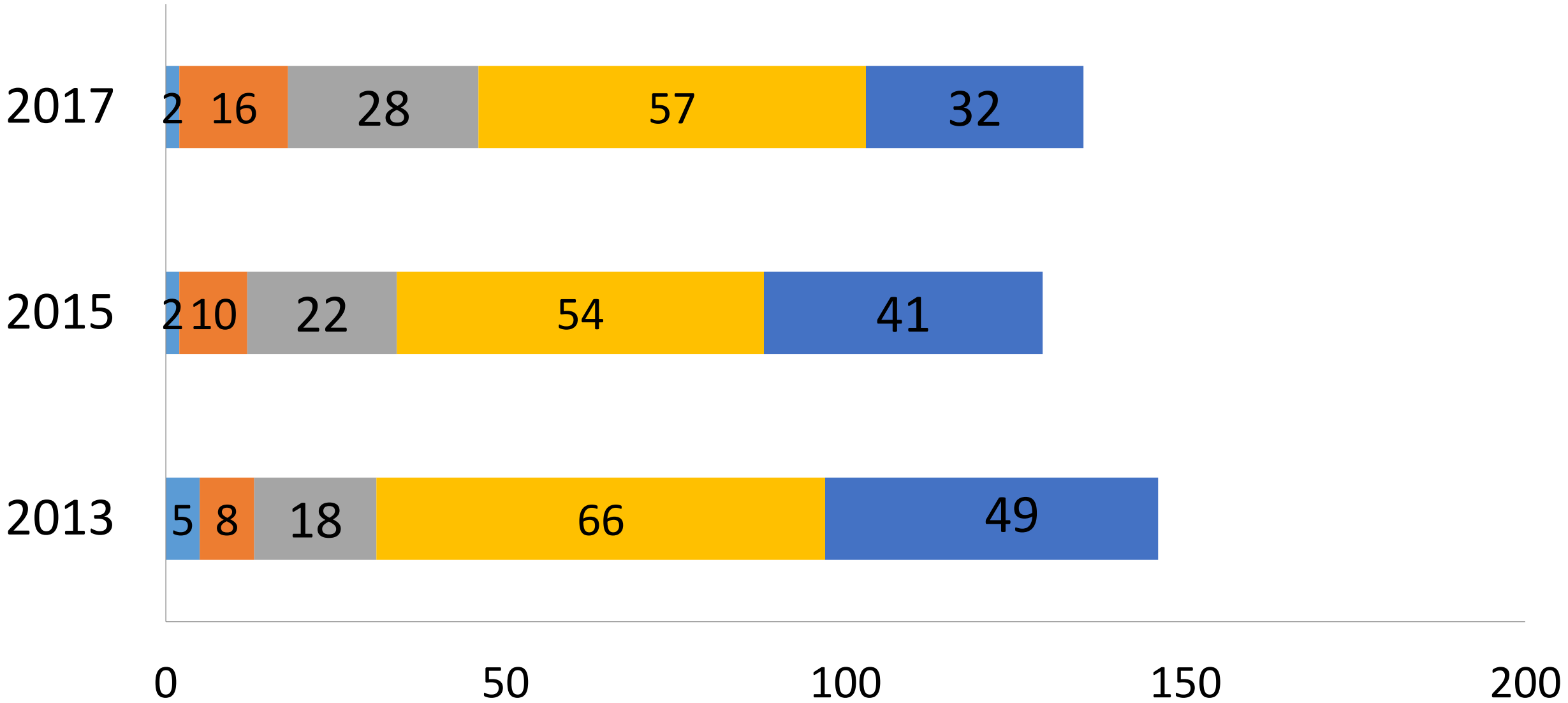

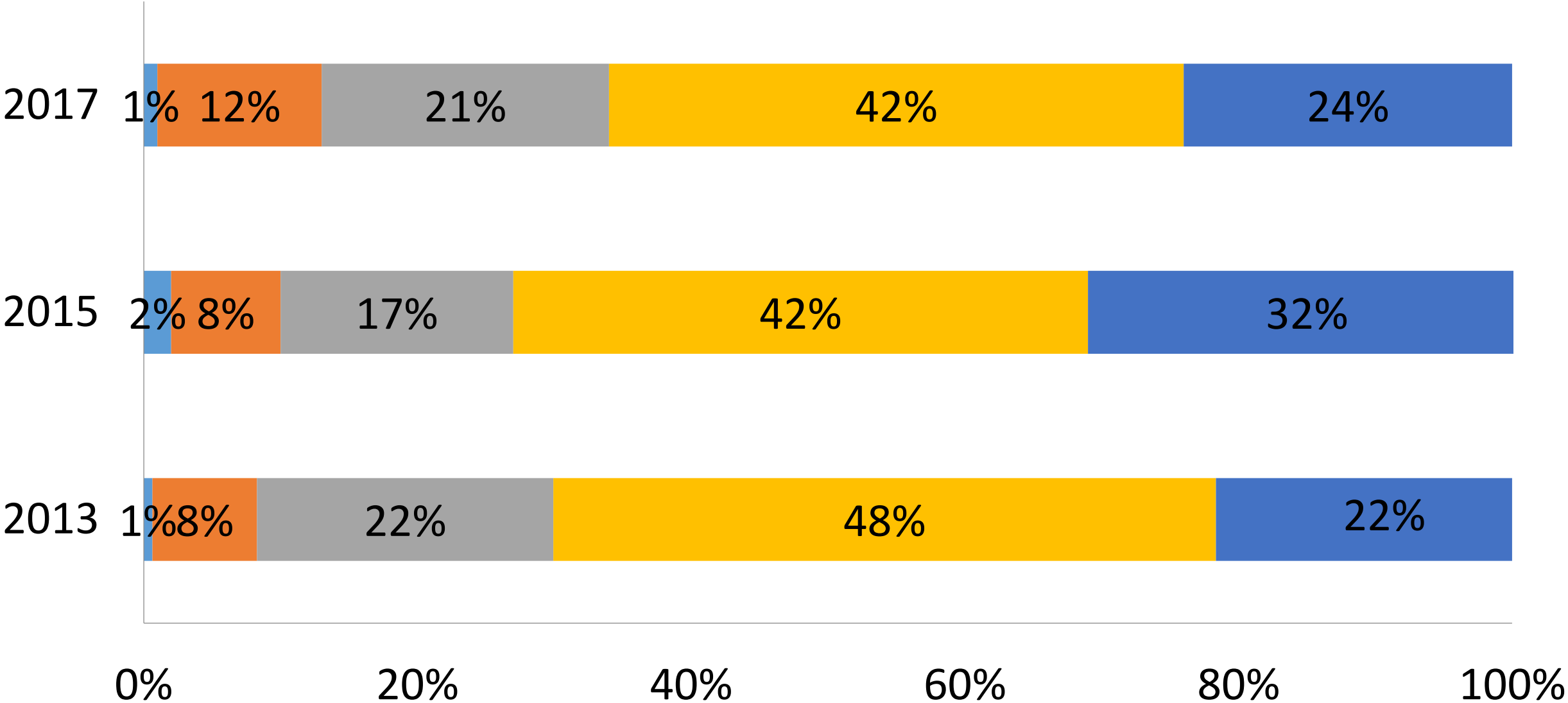
Faculty Teaching in Maine's Nursing Programs – Faculty Age

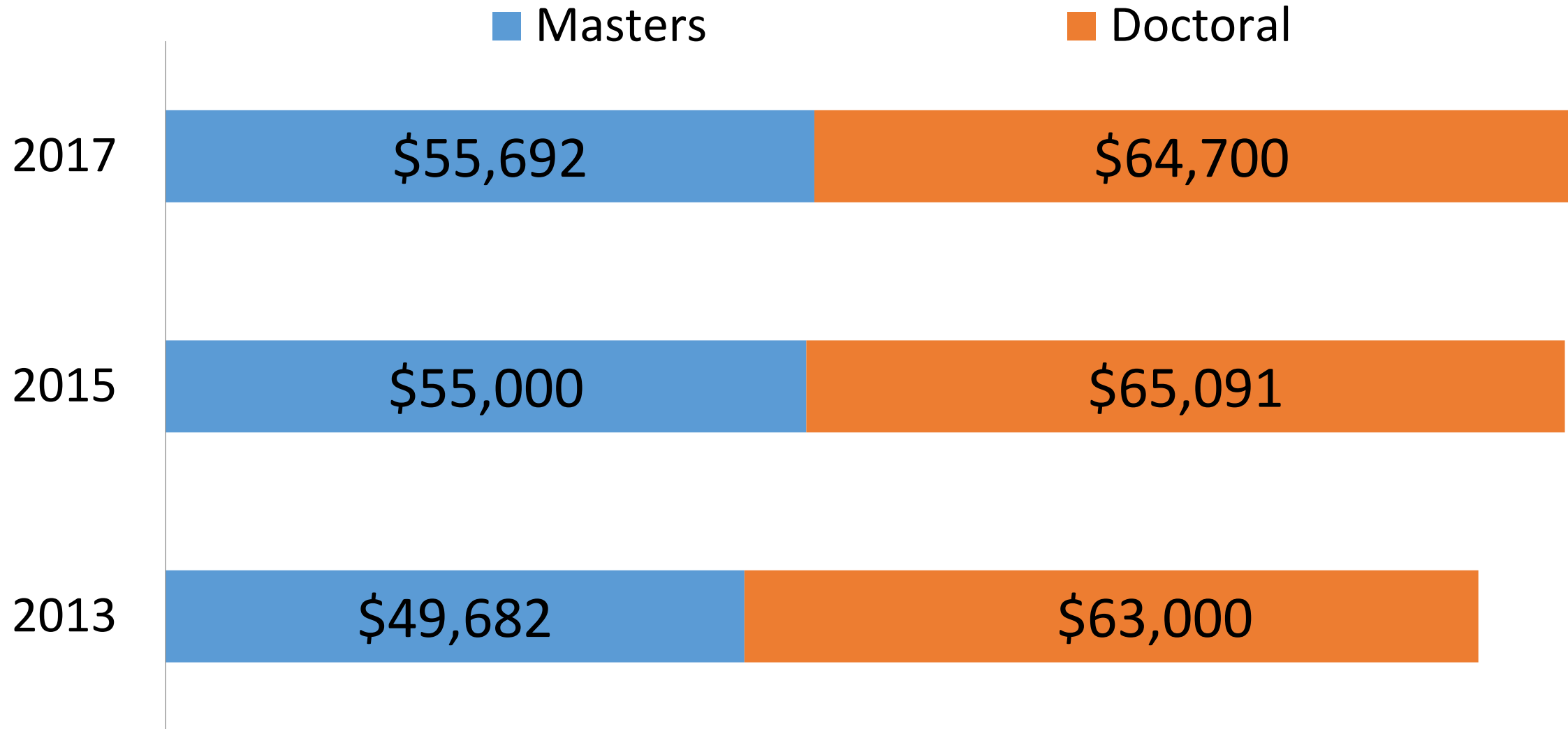


Faculty Teaching in Maine's Nursing Programs – Faculty Age

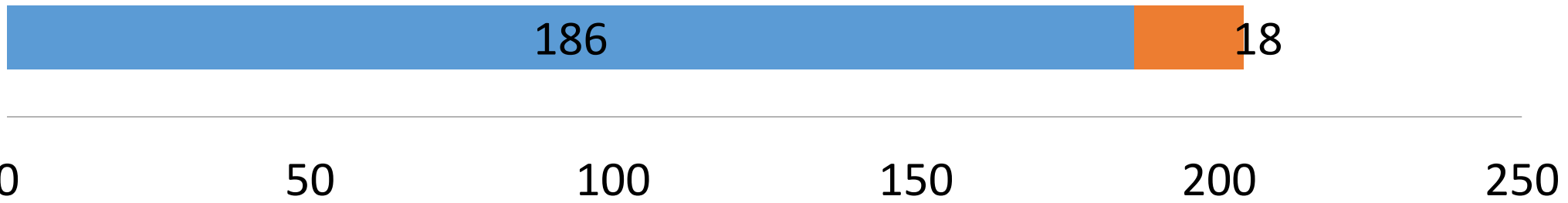


Faculty Teaching in Maine's Nursing Programs – Beginning Salary

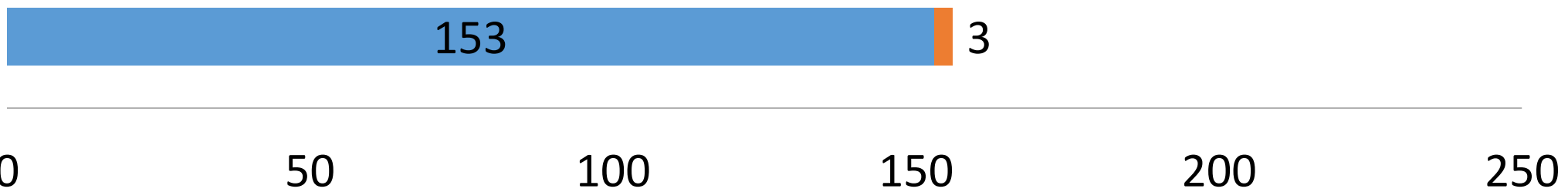

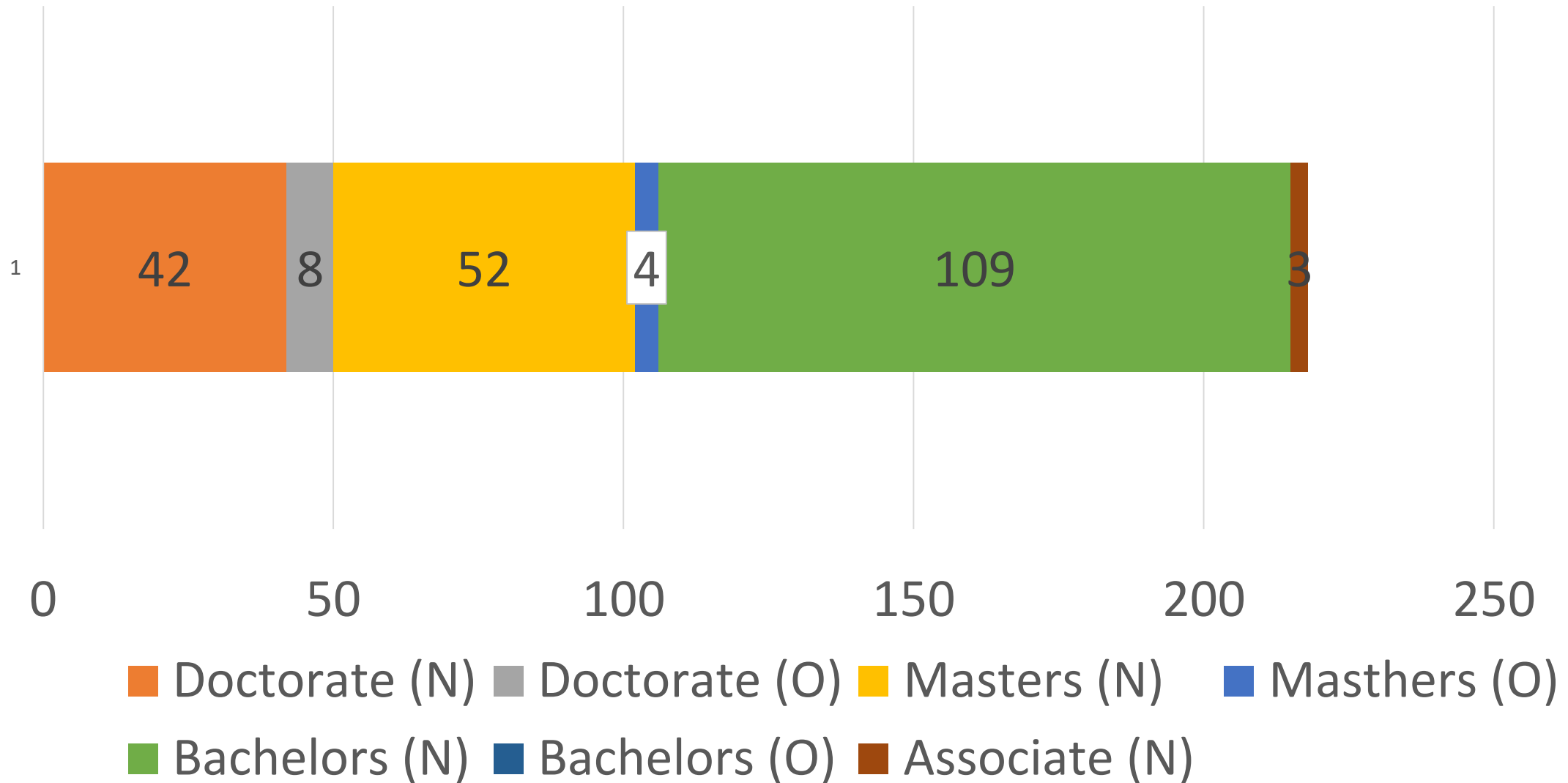

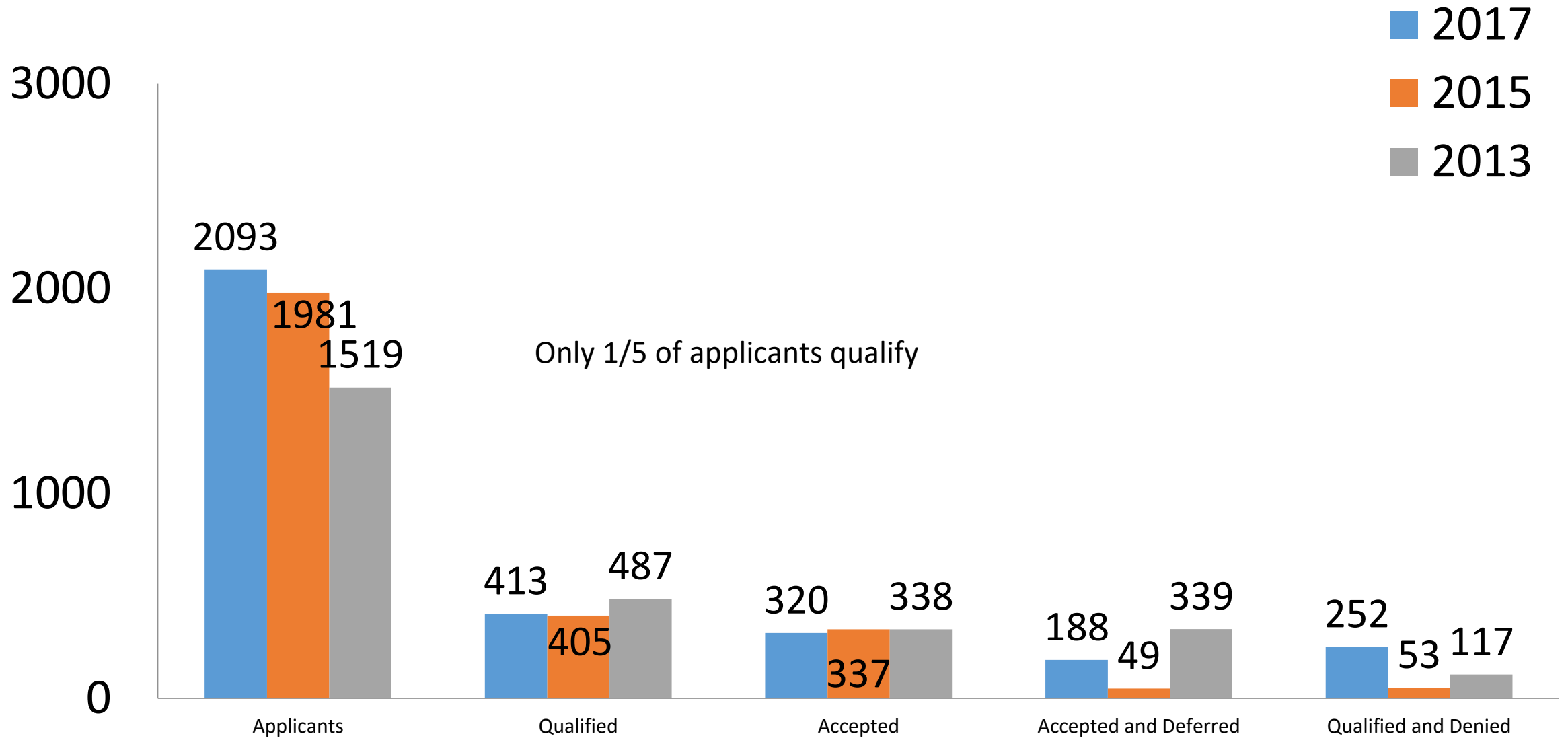

Educational level of PT faculty

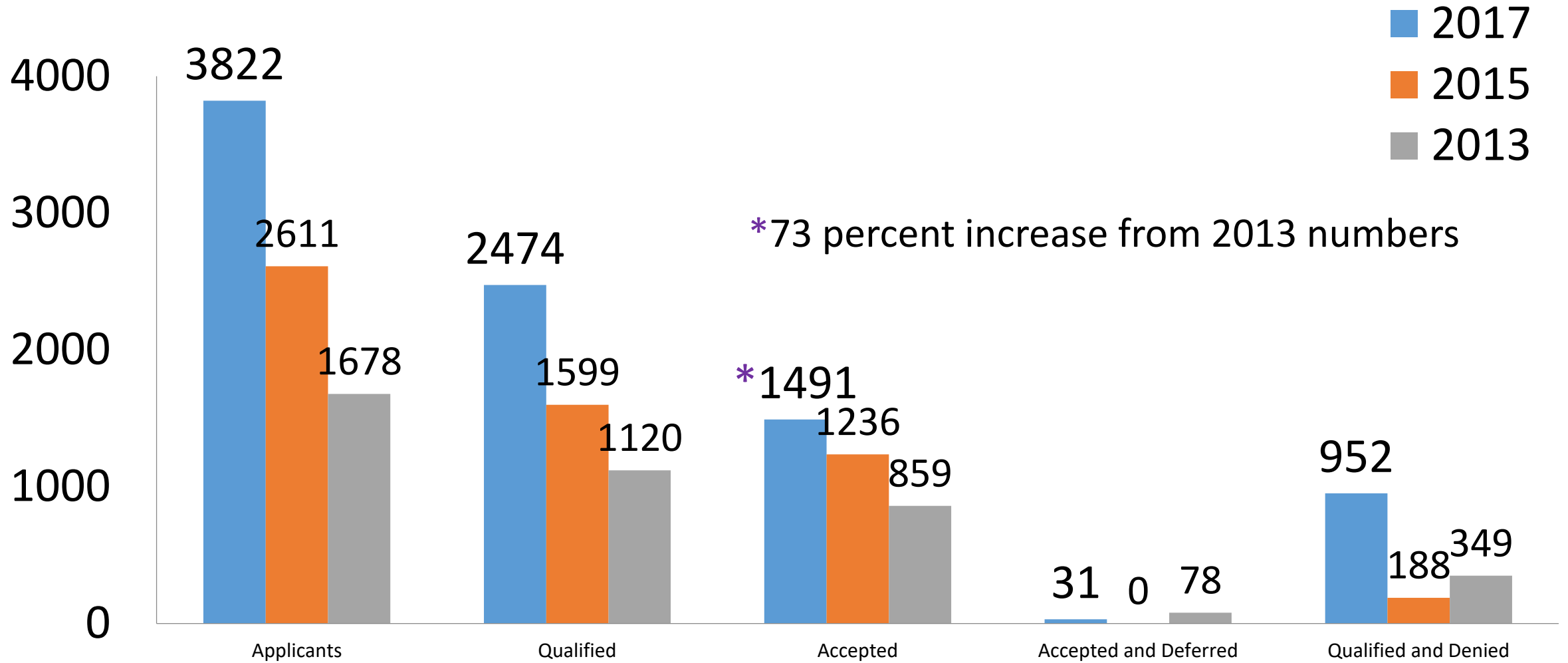

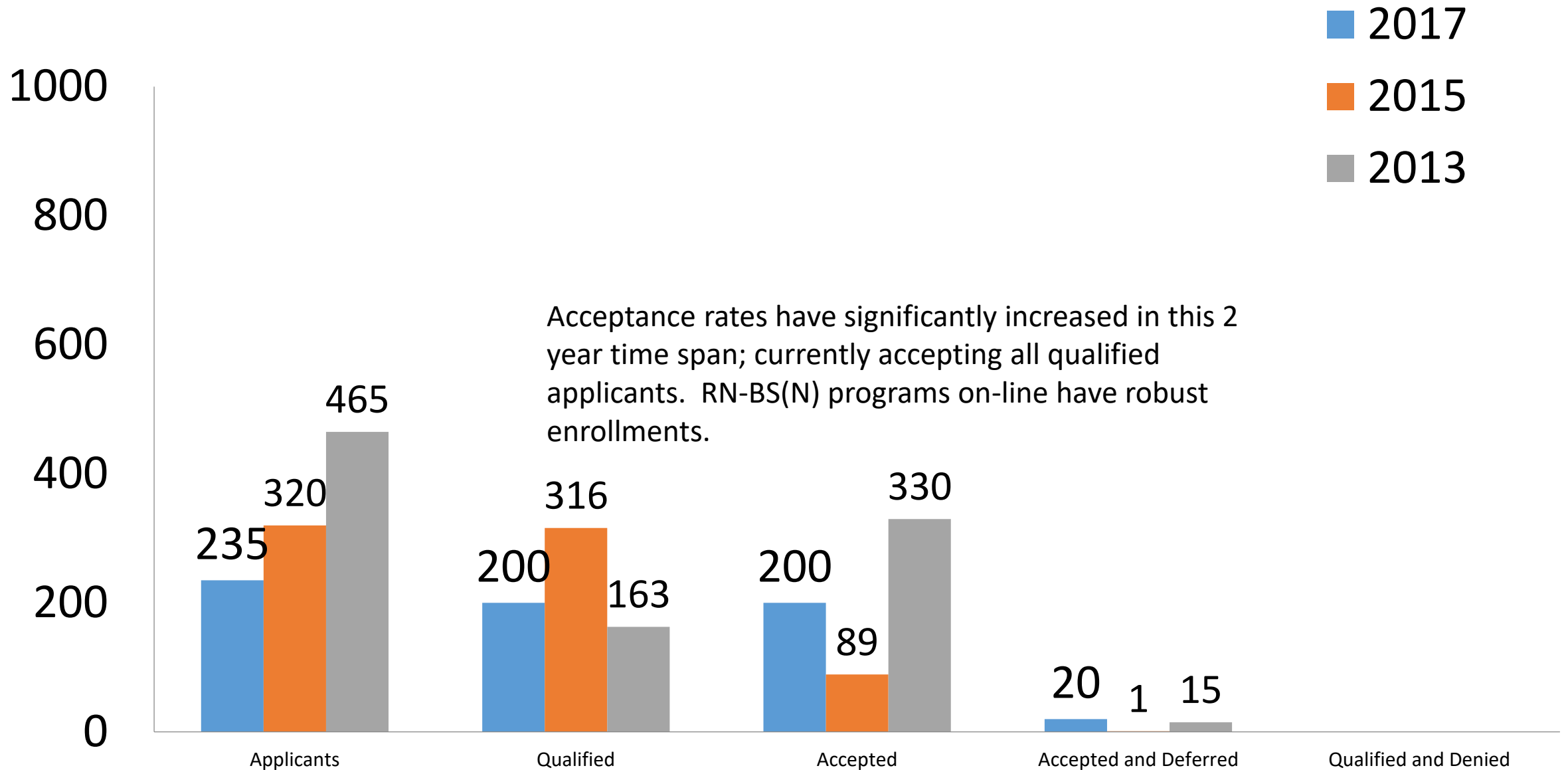

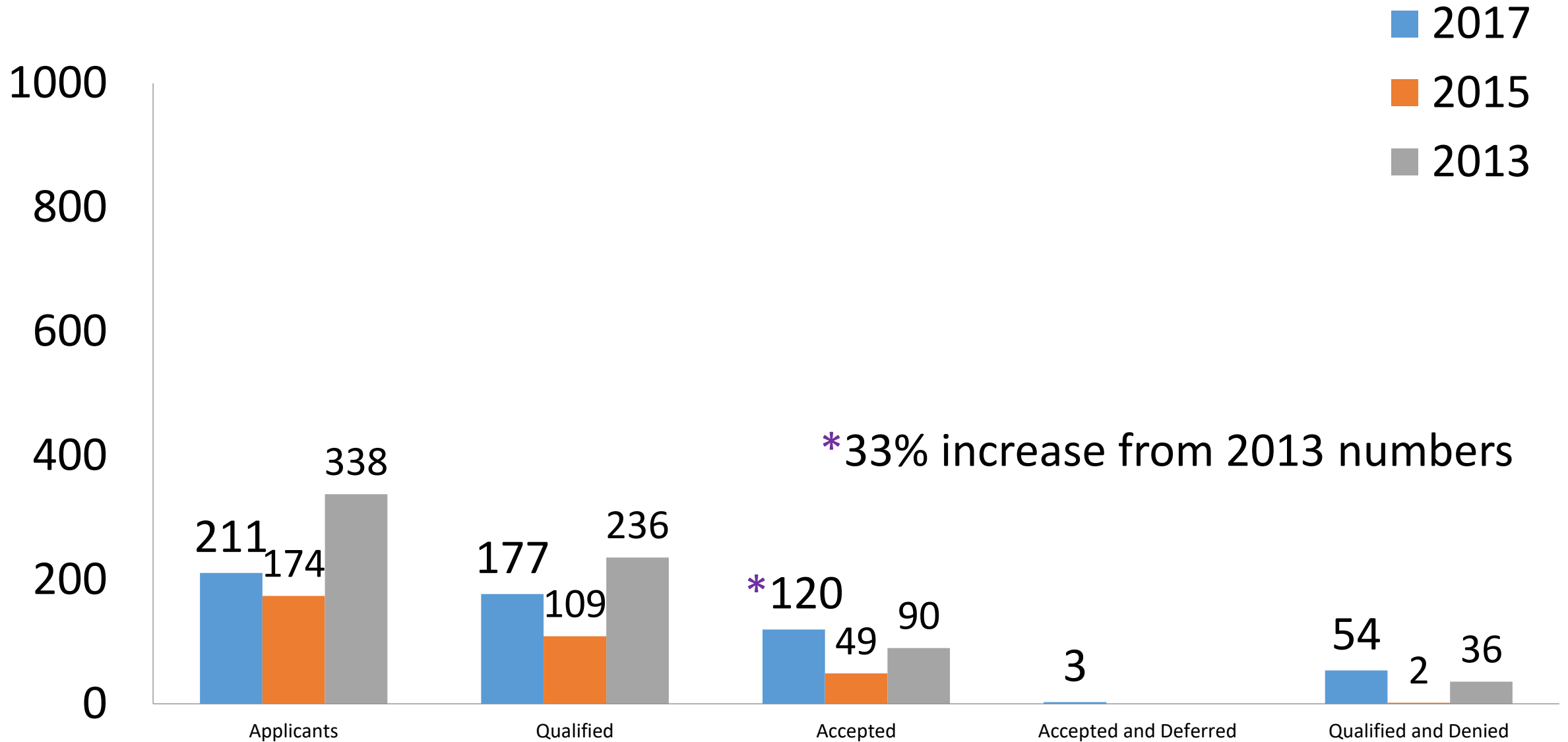
Applications & Admissions to BS Programs

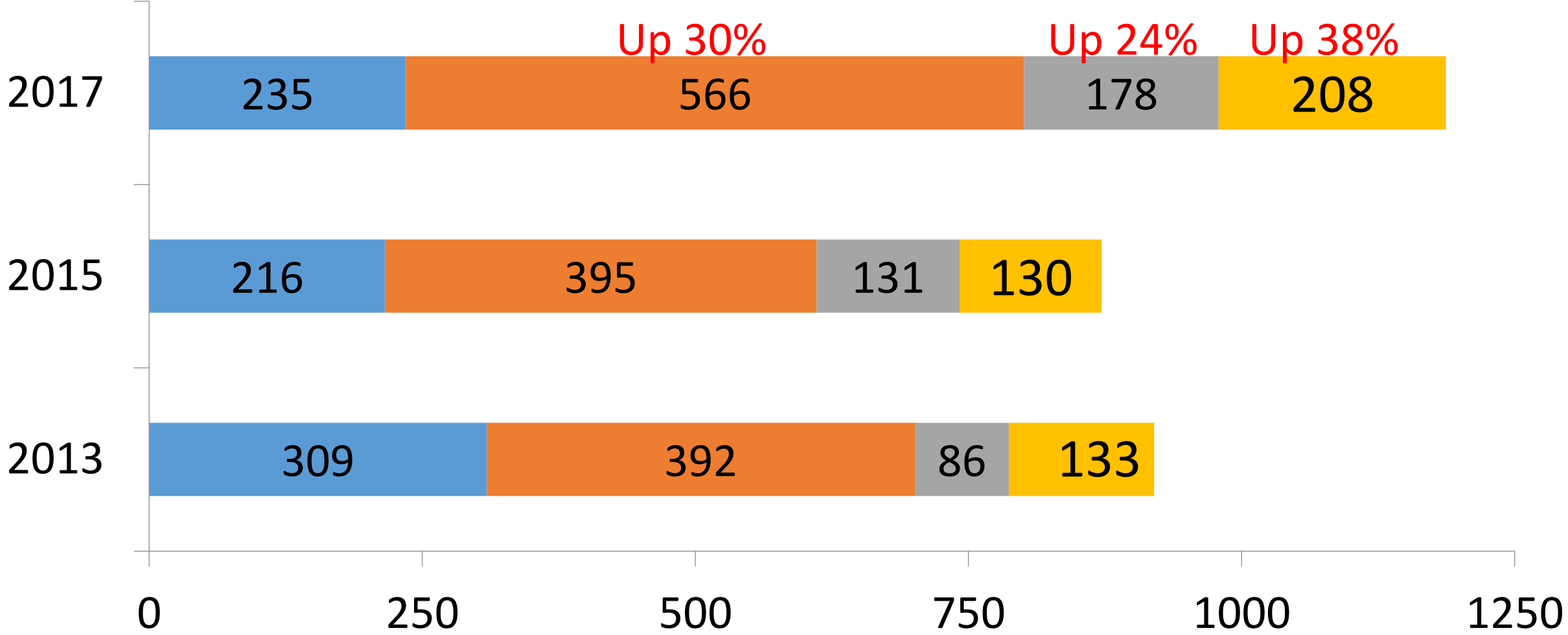

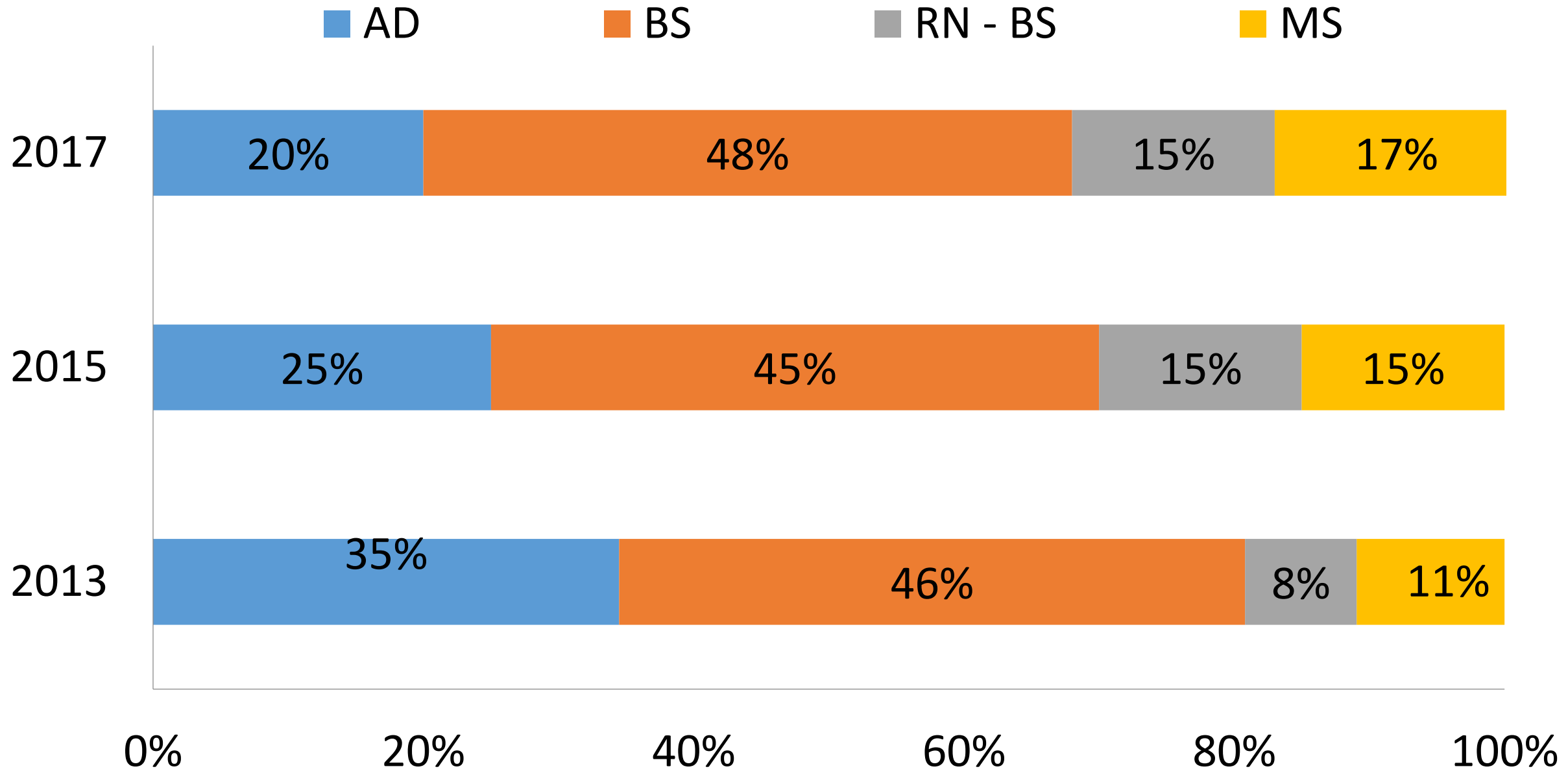

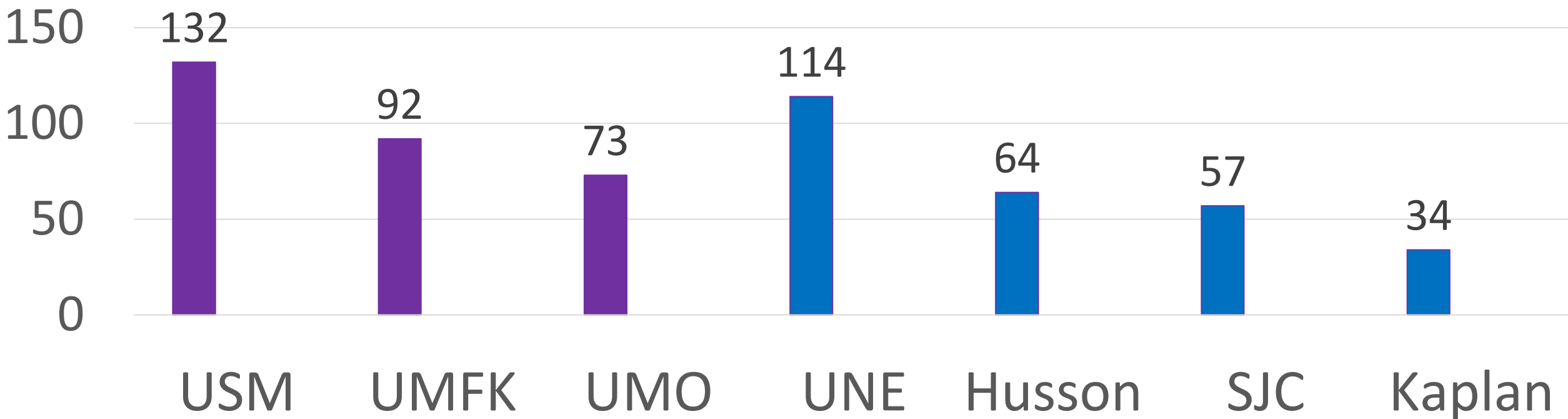


Students in Maine Nursing Programs – % of graduates by program



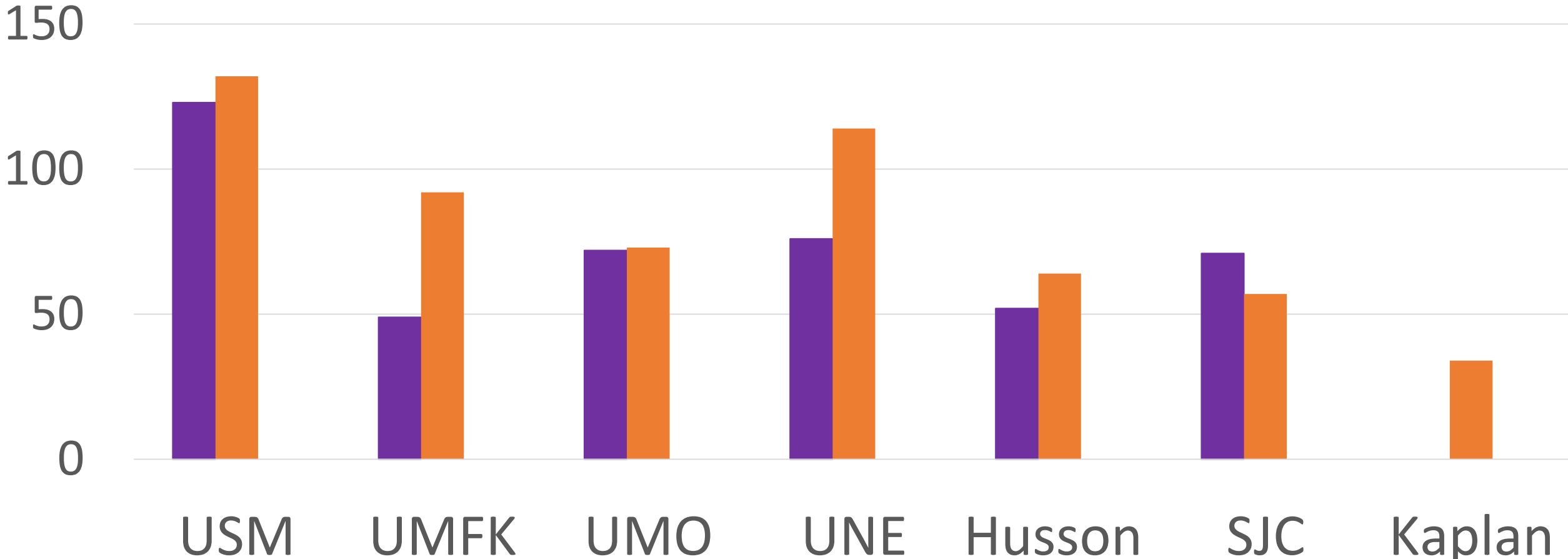
Workforce: number of first time test takers with baccalaureate degrees by school in Maine 2017

Number of students graduating from BS Nursing programs in Maine as First Time Test Takers (new RNS) by program (public and private) (566)



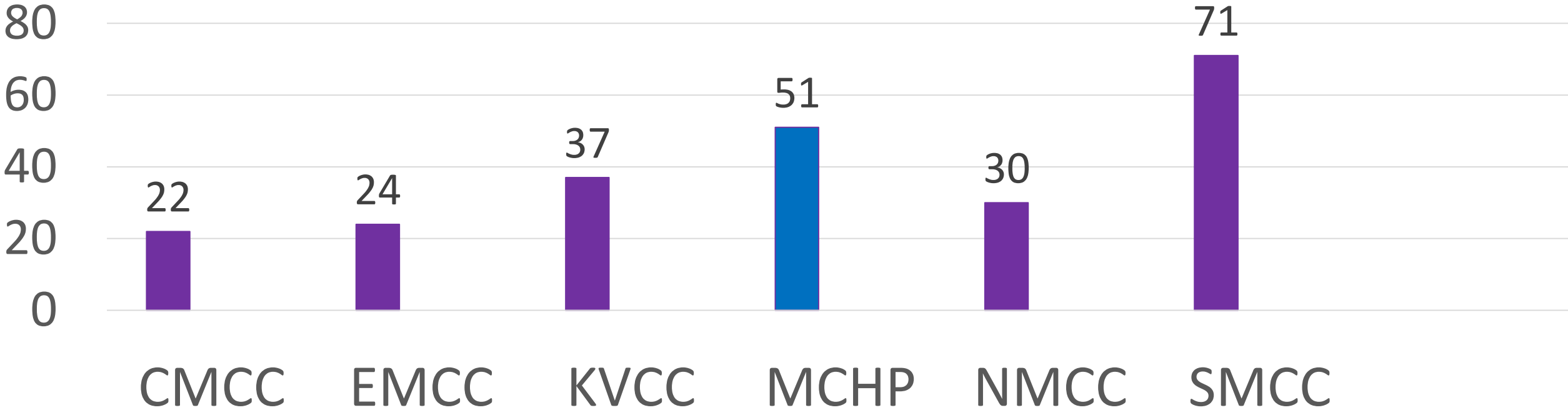
Workforce: Numbers of first time test takers with baccalaureate degrees by school 2015 vs 2017

Completion Calculations

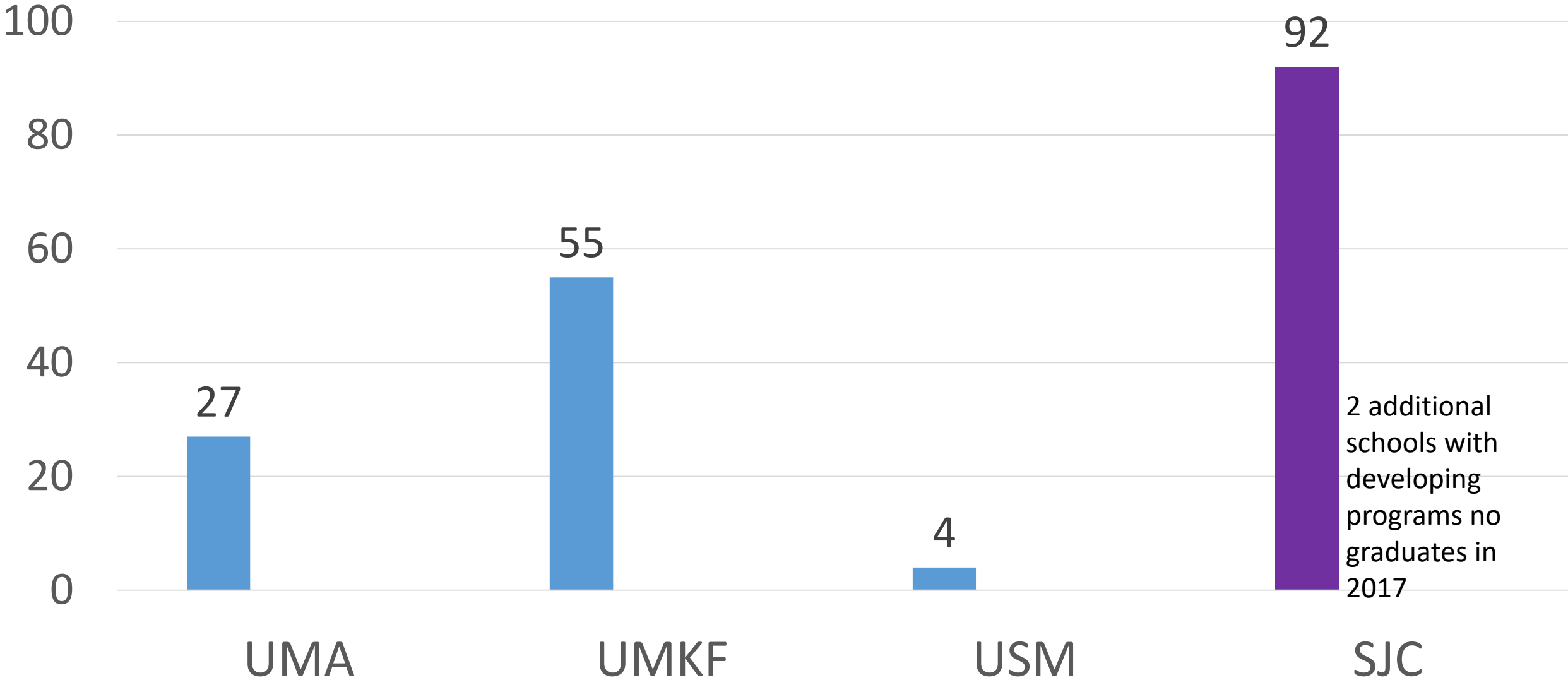
- AD program graduates accepted 337 students in 2015 graduated 235 in 2017. A 70% graduation rate.
- BS programs accepted 859 in 2013 and graduated 566 in 2017 this would be a 65% graduation rate.
- However, many of our students come in as transfer or accelerated students and finish in less than 2 years (admissions in 2015 might be a better number to calculate from). Therefore:
 - In 2015 1236 admissions and 566 BS graduations in 2017; this is only a 45% graduation rate. Likely the number is between these.
- *This is something to focus on. We know we lose students between acceptance and enrollment (and in some programs this number is significant) and it is currently being tracked in the UMS.*

“Spending our faculty”

- In addition to a focus on workforce, Maine nursing schools are also focusing on the ratio of AD/BS nurses in the state by increasing enrollment in the RN to BS programs and increasing the number of nurses with a Masters or Doctoral Degree.
- In making recommendations for academic nursing it is important to weigh in these important priorities as well.
