John Hines began his Philosophy studies as a Jesuit seminarian. There he studied with Juan Moreno, a man later murdered in Salvador for teaching Liberation Theology. This connection with Moreno led him to study Spanish and to teach Philosophy at the Seminario San José de Cuernavaca, Mexico, and the Seminario Evangelista de San Pedro Sula, Honduras.

He earned degrees from Spring Hill College and a Ph.D in Philosophy from Emory University. He was tenured at the Georgia Institute of Technology where he taught for 16 years. He gave up tenure to stay home to care for his young children while his wife studied in graduate school. Subsequently he continued his Philosophy teaching career as a part-time professor. He has taught at St. Michael's College, Emory University, Georgia Institute of Technology, Boston University, Aquinas College, University of Southern Maine, and the two Seminarios.

In Philosophy he specializes in the introduction courses. Since 1969 he has met more than 15,000 students in the classroom.

He is a publishing poet.
